

## List of California Municipalities Regulating Smoking in Multi-Unit Housing

October 2024

There are **109 California municipalities** that have adopted policies that **at minimum** regulate smoking in private units of multi-unit housing.

This list does not indicate the strength of the policies. The list contains jurisdictions with the strongest policies that require all multi-unit housing properties with 2 or more units to be free from all types of secondhand smoke, as well as jurisdictions with policies that have limitations or exemptions, such as applying only to rental multi-unit housing, applying only to a certain percentage of units per building, not covering existing residents, or not covering vaping products or marijuana smoking/vaping.
