



Codebook for Smokefree Multi-Unit Housing Rubric

2024

This codebook provides explanatory information about the questions, response options, scores, and scoring criteria in the Smokefree Multi-Unit Housing Rubric so that PETS users can better understand how the rubric provides the rationale for analyzing and grading California's local tobacco prevention policies.

The Coder Instructions below provide an overview of the rigorous analysis guidelines used by PETS analysts to inform the analysis and scoring of every tobacco prevention policy against each rubric question.

Scoring Criteria

The <u>Smokefree Multi-Unit Housing (MUH) Rubric</u> questions, response options, scores, and scoring criteria were developed and reviewed by tobacco prevention policy experts at ANRF in consultation with CTPP and the PETS Advisory Committee, including attorneys with expertise in local tobacco prevention policy language. Model policy language referenced in the development of the Smokefree Multi-Unit Housing (MUH) Rubric is from The Law and Policy Partnership to End the Commercial Tobacco Epidemic's <u>California Smoke-free Multiunit Housing Model Ordinance</u> (2020), and ChangeLab Solutions' <u>Model California Ordinance Regulating Smoking in Multiunit Residences</u> (2018).

Rubric language that is crossed out (e.g. Q32c1) indicates that PETS analysis is temporarily not being done on these questions and thus data is not yet available for these fields. PETS will resume analysis and data collection on these questions at a future date.
